

Civil War Battles

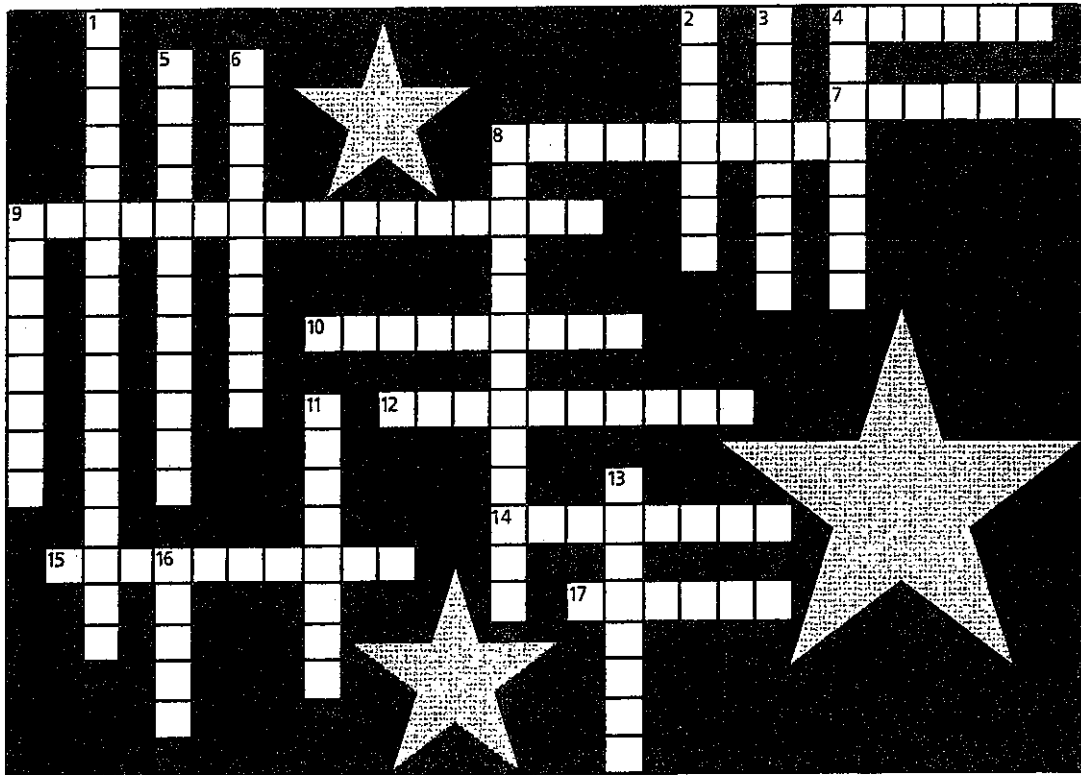
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The Civil War lasted four years and claimed thousands of lives. It divided not only the country but families and friends as well.
